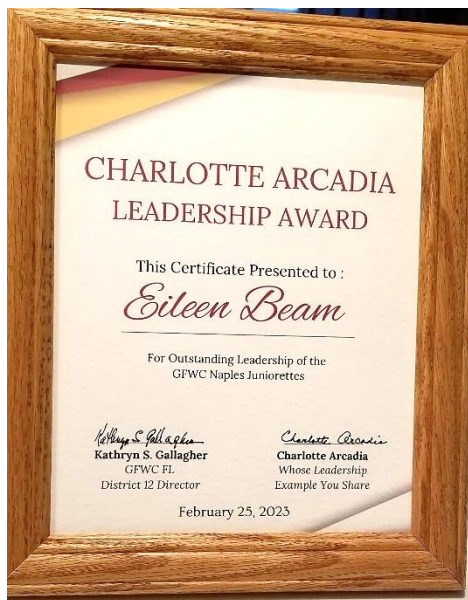


GFWC FL President's Project 2022-2024 **Boggy Creek Camp – A Serious Fun Camp**

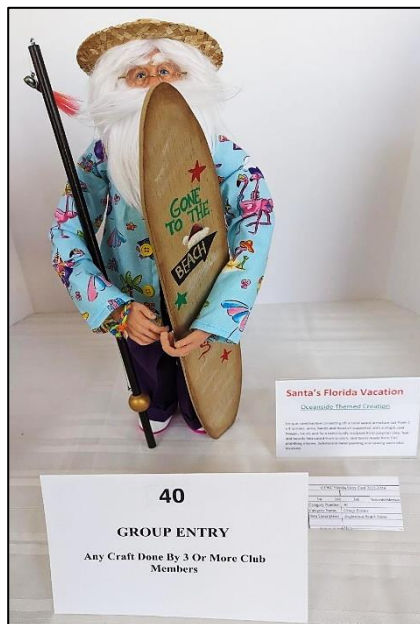

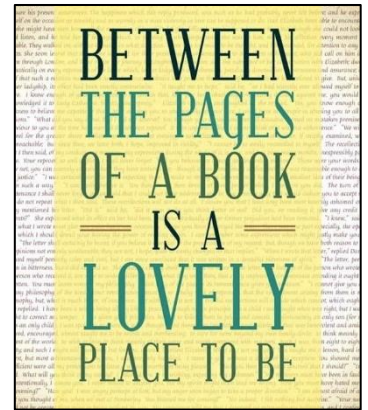

FURRY SCURRY 5K RUN/WALK UPDATE:

Our club was proud to again sponsor the annual South Gulf Cove CCT Furry Scurry 5K Run/Walk held on Saturday, February 4th. This was our third year sponsoring this event, which raises money for local animal charities, two of which we regularly support, EARS and Suncoast Humane. The final total raised was \$15,500, to be distributed to local animal charities.

Recycling Tip of the Month:
From the Waste Management Website

Myth: Hoses, tanks, shower curtains, swing sets, etc. are recyclable

Reality: Just because it's plastic doesn't mean it's recyclable in your recycling program.

If it's not bottles, cans, paper or cardboard, it probably doesn't belong in your curbside mixed recycling bin and may even require special handling. Just because an item is made from plastic, or contains plastic parts, doesn't mean recycling facilities can handle it. There are other resources (e.g., Earth911.org) that can help answer questions about what to do with non-recyclables or household hazardous waste.

Hope everyone is enjoying this beautiful weather, I'm getting outdoors whenever I can before it gets too hot!

As some of you know, my lovely Mum died last year of pancreatic cancer; Mum was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in January 2022 and unfortunately passed

in May 2022. Pancreatic cancer is difficult to diagnose early, the NCI (National Cancer Institute) estimated that around 8% of total pancreatic cancer patients can survive for about 5 years. There's a nationwide walk on Saturday, April 29, 2023, organized by Pancreatic Action Cancer Network called "PanCan PurpleStride - the ultimate walk to end pancreatic cancer." I'm walking at least 3 miles in memory of Mum and hoping to raise funds to help end pancreatic cancer. BEDTIME BAGS PROJECT

The fourth delivery of bags to the Guardian ad Litem Office in Punta Gorda was scheduled to take place during the week of February 20th. This donation is considered the 4th because the Bedtime Bags Project was started in April of 2022 with a commitment to make four/quarterly donations to the Punta Gorda office of GAL.

Unfortunately, due to circumstances beyond anyone's control, that event was postponed until March 13th.

For those members who may not be aware of this project, the following is a brief recap of it.

During a meeting in February of last year, then-President Kathryn Gallagher and Lois LeVasseur met with Jessica Stanfield, Executive Director of the GAL Foundation, via zoom to discuss the logistics of this exciting, new project. It was determined that the best way for RWWC to help the children of Charlotte County who are in foster care would be to provide to the Punta Gorda GAL Office 12 bags quarterly, filled with items such as pajamas, toothbrush/toothpaste, a comfort item/stuffed animal as well as an age-appropriate book. There would be three age groups for the bag distribution: Toddler, Adolescent and Teen. Each age group would consist of two boys and two girls. The GAL Office in Punta Gorda would be contacted each quarter to determine what items are most needed at that time.



I am pleased to say that this project has been met with an overwhelming and more-than-generous response! It has been our desire to include all 5 Community Service Project Committees, as well as the Signature Project Domestic Violence and other standing committees. To date, more than 90 bags have been created by the Sew n Sews! The project has received donations of pajamas, toothbrushes & paste and other hygiene items, hand knitted or crocheted washcloths, fuzzy socks, fleece blankets and comfort toys galore! Boxes of books have been located, leveled by age and ready for inclusion in the bags. Others have been purchased as part of the Diversity and Kindness library project.

It is only due to the generosity of our members that this project has proven be successful. You are all SUPERHEROES!
