


Soaring with President Elect Sara



COMMITTEE UPDATE: Our 2nd committee meeting was held on May 2nd. We will be doing a collection at the May general meeting for our local animal rescue groups, EARS and Suncoast Humane. The following items are requested for this collection:

<u>EARS</u> requests: Wet and dry cat food, bleach, laundry detergent, and tall kitchen drawstring garbage bags.

<u>Suncoast Humane</u> requests: Purina adult dog food, Greennies pill pockets, large Nylabone and Kong toys, plastic litter scoops, meow mix original choice dry cat food and Fancy Feast tender feast variety pack canned kitten food.

<u>Ice Cream Planters:</u> we will be offering the opportunity to make an ice cream cone basil planter. Ice cream cone planters can be put directly into a pot or the ground. Basil plants are mosquito repellent plants. We will have 36 Planters available from 9:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. during the Social Hour. Please look for the Environment CSP committee table. Planters are offered on a first come, first served basis while supplies last.



Our first project was the purchase of a recycling bin to be used during our meetings and events at the RWA Community Center. It was dedicated at our April meeting. Two of our committee members have volunteered to empty the bin and dispose of the recycled material. A picture of the dedication is below.

Recycle Beyond the Bag

We will be offering a new project in the fall which entails collecting certain plastic items. While the program will start in the fall, most likely November, you can start collecting this plastic over the summer and then turn it in when we have begun collections.

Half a year has gone by! I hope everyone has a terrific Summer! We will certainly miss our members who have gone back North for the Summer.

The Knit n Chat ladies worked very hard to get ready for the Bazaar in March – which went very, very well and was terrifically received by all those in attendance. Items included hats, scarves, dishcloths, scrubbies and potholders, fidget sleeves, crocheted jewelry, eyeglass/phone cases, Christmas and Fall items and much more!

We are making a list (and checking it twice) for items to be included in the October 2023 Bazaar along with the other ongoing projects which include, but are not limited to:

- Mittens for the Mitten Lady Project at Myakka River Elementary School;

You don't need to know how to knit! There are ladies who crochet and/or loom knit as well as those who are learning. Besides which, we have a lot of fun!!

WHEN: Tuesday mornings
TIME: 9:30 – 11:30 or 12:00

Also, there is always a need for donations of yarn. Call me if you have any questions or concerns.

I have included crochet Scrubbie pattern:

Crochet Scrubbie

This pattern is written using standard US crochet terminology.

- Ch Chain
- **Fpdc** Front Post Double Crochet
- **Dc** Double Crochet
- Rep Repeat
- Slst Slip Stitch
- St(s) Stitch(es)



Round 1: Ch 22. Join with a slst to the first chain to form a ring. Ch 3. Make 25 dc *around* the foundation chain (don't attempt to work into the chains). Do not join, continue with next round.

Round 2: Fpdc first dc. Fpdc every st. Do not join at end of the round.

Repeat

Continue working a fpdc for every st in a spiral fashion until your work measures approximately 4" tall from starting edge. Fasten off leaving a 6" tail.

Assembly

For the top and bottom of the scrubby, weave the tail in and out of each stitch in the round. Pull the tail to draw up the closure.

Flatten the scrubby with the drawn up ends in the center of the scrubby. Thread one tail through the center of the scrubby and tie it off with the other end. Trim the tails and you're done!
