



COVID RESURGENCE

Information from my Doctor:


Symptoms:

- Fever call doctor if over 101
- 2. Cough Dry/productive that may be persistent
- 3. Fatigue tiredness/weakness can be prolonged a month or more
- 4. Body aches
- 5. Headache
- 6. Shortness of breath especially on exertion
- 7. Sore throat
- 8. Loss of taste/smell
- 9. Congestion/runny nose
- 10. Gl symptoms
- 11. Chills/shivering
- 12. Chest pain
- 13. Skin rashes

Treatment:

- 1. Isolation and Quarantine to help prevent spread
- 2. Symptom management OTC medicine Acetaminophen, Ibuprofen, Cough medication (antibiotics do not treat viral infections.
- 3. Fluids and rest (this is the most important one) sit on the couch and watch TV. If you do too much, you can cause your symptoms to RETURN. Start back SLOW.
- 4. Oxygen and/or hospitalization in severe cases.
