





Through the past 48 years Danica has worn many hats such as Club Vice President, Arts & Crafts Chairman, and Christmas Gazebo Lighting Cookie Chairman to name a few. She also taught classes in painting, cooking and flower arranging.

Danica performed in several of the Club "Skits" and was always available to help in any and all Club projects.

For several years Danica was a member of the Board of Directors for Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Englewood. Combining fund raising with GFWC Rotonda West Woman's Club. While serving on the Board as a fund raiser, Danica also volunteered as a Big Sister Mentor.

In 2022 while planning a trip to Croatia for her sister's birthday, Danica inquired if there was a GFWC Woman's Club in the city of Zagreb, Croatia. President Kathryn Gallagher spoke with Kathryn Sowers, GFWC International Liaisons Committee Chairman, expressing what a great idea it would be to have GFWC International President Debra Strahanoski write a letter of greetings from GFWC for Danica to hand deliver to the Zagreb Woman's Club. After locating the Zagreb Woman's Club a date was set up for her to visit. Danica did deliver the GFWC greetings and listened to stories about their organization of women who live the volunteer spirit in Croatia, just as we do here in the US. Many photos were taken.

GFWC Rotonda West Woman's Club 50th Anniversary



On May 1, 1974, the Rotonda West Woman's Club was chartered as a member of the Florida Federation of Women's Clubs. To celebrate, Helen Allison, the club's first President, suggested that a flagpole be erected in

the traffic circle on Cape Haze Drive as a Community Bicentennial project. That project won a National Award.

Billie Dodds was the second President and her project was the formation of a local library. The five hundred book facility was dedicated in January 1977. The library continues to be available in the Rotonda Community Center to all members of the community and is still maintained by members of the Rotonda West Woman's Club.

In those early years \$1,000 was contributed to the West Charlotte Civic Center Building Fund, which became the Joseph Tringali Center. Mrs. Tringali was a charter member of the club. \$1,300 was donated to the Englewood Ambulance Fund. There was representation on the board to establish the Rotonda West Neighborhood Watch program. President Charlotte Arcadia's project purchased and donated to American Legion Post 113 an AED medical device designed to analyze the heart rhythm and deliver an electric shock to victims of ventricular fibrillation. Charlotte arranged for classes to teach club members and Legion members how to use the device and save lives.

The Club's ongoing focus on education is notable for having donated over \$125,000 in scholarships to Lemon Bay High School Seniors and to Continuing Education applicants.

Through the years the club held Rummage Sales, Bazaars, Fashion Shows, Teas and Trivia Nights to raise money to support our philanthropic purpose. Each year thousands of dollars are contributed to local charities as well as in-kind donations of clothing, groceries and pet food for our neighbors in need. Donations are made to GFWC Florida sponsored charities, such as Operation Smile and to Camp Boggy Creek. 50 productive years of Living the Volunteer Spirit through service to the community went quickly.






Our own members were joined by GFWC Past President Dianne Foerster, four Charlotte County Commissioners, representatives from the RWA and many of our 501c3 partners with whom we have worked and donated over the years. They have returned so much good will to us.



In April at the GFWC FL Convention, we were delighted to receive the Inaugural Dianne Foerster Club Interaction Award for our combined efforts with our Charlotte County Sister Clubs on the first ever GFWC National Day of Service, but we also continued our endeavors in Charlotte County alongside of GFWC Woman's Club of Port Charlotte and GFWC Punta Gorda Woman's Club through the year.

As an example, when we had no place for our Club to meet when the Covid Pandemic hit, the Lions Club of Englewood offered their clubhouse to us for our board meetings. When Hurricane Ian devastated District 12, the Lions Club of Englewood was spared from damage, so they were happy for us to bring in and unload a 26ft U-Haul Truck filled with food, water, clothing, and baby care needs, driven by Tampa Woman's Club President Michele Small, assisted by GFWC 2nd Vice President Jolie Frankfurth. We filled their entire clubhouse, sorted and sent everything out to our District 12 Clubs and local Food Outreach organizations. When we had no place to hold our annual Rummage Sale...the Lions Club was more than accommodating and donated the use of their clubhouse once again, so that we could raise funds for our own outreach. GFWC RWWC has been happy to offer a box to collect used glasses for the Lions program. We advertise their holiday flower sales and patronize their seasonal dinners, but we will always be grateful to the Englewood Lions for their generous support: and their wonderful gift to us for our 50th Anniversary!




